IMPORTANT: ALL IMPACTED MAUI RESIDENTS AND BUSINESS OWNERS should apply for Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Assistance

IMMEDIATELY: <https://www.fema.gov/disaster/4724>. FEMA was just activated today. Once business owners apply, they may qualify for loans through the Small Business Association.

Here are ways you can help our Maui members and residents. PLEASE LET ME KNOW IF YOU HEAR OF ANYONE ELSE NEEDING ASSISTANCE.

1. **DONATE DIRECTLY TO OUR MAUI MEMBERS WHO WERE IMPACTED:**

- **Norman Russell, Jr.** – Venmo Account: [@NR-Junior](#). Last 4 of his phone number is **8340**. He lost his home in the Lahaina fire and was reunited with his family today.
- **Bradley Jackson** – Venmo Account: [@BradleyMaui](#). Last 4 of his phone number is **8859**. He has been on his boat offshore for the last two days and just got back onshore. His truck was destroyed when it was engulfed by the fire in the harbor parking lot. **Mahalo to Brother Dave Reyes for picking up Bradley and taking him home!**
- **Michael Anderson** – Venmo Account: [@Michael-Anderson-981](#). Last 4 of his phone number is **2085**. His home was spared, and he has graciously opened his home to a family whose home was destroyed. He has setup a community supply station at the beach park.

2. **VOLUNTEER**

- **Willy Reyes** is going through the **American Red Cross** disaster relief training, starting tomorrow. The training will take 4 to 10 days to complete and then he will go to Maui. His 'ohana's house was destroyed, and they were able to escape with the clothes on their backs. - As a non-profit, our organization could qualify to be trained for federal disaster readiness and deployed in times of need. I have a call in to see what the procedure is.

3. **DONATE TO THE IATSE WALSH-DITOLLA-SPIVAK FOUNDATION (Through Paypal):**

This fund helps support all IATSE members impacted by disasters.

1. Download the Paypal App or go to PayPal.com and create an account.
2. Click on "Send Money".
3. Enter email address IATSEPayments@IATSE.net
4. Enter the amount of your donation.
5. In the "What's this for?" field, enter "Walsh-DiTolla-Spivak Foundation".
6. Do not specify a "what event".

4. **SIGN THE MAUI DISASTER RESPONSE and RECOVERY SUPPORT FORM:**

- This form is collecting information for those who need aid and those who can provide aid. It is a collaborative effort between **Maui Rapid Response, Maui Mutual Aid, Maui Strong** and other organizations.

HAWAIIAN FIRESTORM CRISIS

Dear Brothers & Sisters,

Our brothers and sisters on the island of Maui and elsewhere in Hawaii are facing the devastating consequences of raging fires that have so far killed 36 people, injured several hundred more and destroyed the entire town of Lahaina, leveling homes and businesses and ravaging huge swaths of green tropical landscape.

In response to this ongoing crisis, our Locals are organizing an emergency response to help deliver critical aid to these communities in desperate need of support.

We are asking our Union family to pull together and give whatever you can in terms of donations or volunteering time toward providing this assistance.

Shipping containers are at the ILWU Memorial Hall in Wilmington to collect and stow these emergency items for delivery to Maui. Items can be dropped off at the Memorial Hall starting today from 8:00 a.m. – 8:00 p.m. all the way until August 17, 2023.

The items in most demand:

- Baby food
- Diapers, wipes
- Toiletries (toothbrushes, body wash, soaps, etc.)
- Sleeping bags
- Pillows
- Bedding
- Bed mats
- Clothing (especially kid's clothes)
- Towels
- Sandals
- Basic home necessities
- Monetary donations are also welcomed at your Local business office.
